Dear Parishioners,

We have been gifted 171 years of God's grace, presence, and activity throughout Union County in our beloved parish of St. Bridget. Since before the Civil War, there have been at our parish innumerable, grace-filled events, especially including baptisms, weddings, funerals, classes, festivals, meals, ministry and so much more. That patrimony of our parish's life is renewed each time we gather for Mass, and that only ever happens inside our beautiful church. It is inside those walls that we worship God together, and He makes us one in the Body of Christ. What a life we have been given! What a legacy we have received!!

For this reason, after thorough discernment and consultation, we are embarking on a capital campaign to raise \$350,000 that will allow us to be more responsive to our parish needs and mission.

This brochure shares the necessary plans to ensure that we raise the funds necessary to maintain God's house and continue to grow God's Kingdom beyond our church building and campus. Whether you are new to our church or have been here from the beginning, I ask you to prayerfully reflect on how you have been blessed by this parish. I invite you to prayerfully consider how you are able to contribute your financial gifts to this crucial effort for our parish and join with me in praying for the success of our campaign. Sacrificial giving is an expression of our faith and an important way to respond to God in gratitude.

The Suggested Gift Chart details pledges ranging from \$1,500 to \$120,000 payable over three years. This wide range of gift opportunities makes it possible for virtually every family to take part in the program.

Our Parish History

The work of the Catholic Church started in Liberty in 1849 by immigrants from Ireland. Mass was celebrated in private homes once per month. Father Henry Peters, resident priest of Connersville, took charge of Liberty in 1853. The first Catholic Church was built in 1854 but unfortunately was destroyed by fire just four years later in 1858. Father Peters rebuilt a brick church in 1859, which was used for Masses until 1905. Father Peters then placed the church under the patronage of St Bridget of Gaels. In 1905 the present church was built. St Bridget has had 23 priests to lead our flock towards greater spiritual paths. We are grateful to all of those who have gone before us, their perseverance and faith leaving each of us the responsibility to continue the legacy of this Catholic Church serving God.



Campaign Case

In recent years it has become apparent that there is need to replace the mortar on the exterior of our church which needs immediate attention to prevent further damage to the interior of the church. Tackling this project will allow our faithful to continue to focus on our most important mission - bringing people to Christ.

After much discussion and discernment, we have decided to move forward with the following plan: We will complete tuckpointing on all existing bricks, replacing the deteriorated mortar with new, durable mortar. In some areas, the mortar is loose or entirely missing. Tuckpointing is the process of removing and replacing damaged mortar joints in brick walls, this will not only enhance the church's appearance but also help ensure its long-term structural integrity.

As we look to the future of our parish, these repairs are vital to preserving our church building!

Project Scope

The church needs tuckpointing. There are places where the mortar is loose or completely gone. Tuckpointing is the process of repairing mortar joints in brick walls by removing and replacing damaged mortar. It improves the appearance of the church and helps maintain its structural integrity. We plan on cutting all mortar joints on all existing bricks and replacing with new mortar. Work to be completed as follows:

Bell Tower

>> ESTIMATED Cost: \$90,000.00

North side of church

>> ESTIMATED Cost: \$75,000.00

East side of church

>> ESTIMATED Cost: \$100,000.00

West side of church

>> ESTIMATED Cost: \$100,000.00

South side of church

>> ESTIMATED Cost: \$75,000.00



Frequently Asked Questions

Q. When will the work begin?

A. The work will begin as the funds become available from the Capital Campaign.

Q. What will happen if we go over our goal?

A. All gifts collected after we exceed our goal will be put towards projects to improve the interior of St. Bridget.

Q. Can I fulfill my pledge online?

A. Yes, we have set up a page on our website where you may fulfill your pledge.

Q. Why should I make a pledge?

A. Most people take advantage of time-payments for major purchases. A pledge to the parish Capital Campaign is a "time-payment plan" that makes it possible for you to meet your parish obligations without undue hardship. Pledges enable you to consider a more significant contribution to the campaign rather than a one-time gift.

Q. Is my pledge over and above my Sunday Offering?

A. Yes. We can only reach our goal with a little extra sacrifice. We cannot reach our goal if we reduce our weekly offerings in order to make a pledge to the Capital Campaign. The parish will continue to have normal operating expenses during the pledge period.

Q. Who will be asked to support the Campaign?

A. Every parish family will be invited to be a part of this effort. It is our hope that every parish family will make a sacrificial gift for this major effort according to his or her financial ability. We hope everyone will play a conscientious role in renewing the future of the parish. We invite all families to participate in our spiritual growth program over the next 3 years also.

Q. What happens if I cannot fulfill my pledge?

A. Pledges are made in good faith and accepted as such. If hardship or illness prevents you from fulfilling your pledge, let the parish know, and other arrangements will be made.

Q. What if I would like to give stocks, real estate, grain, livestock or some other kind of gift?
